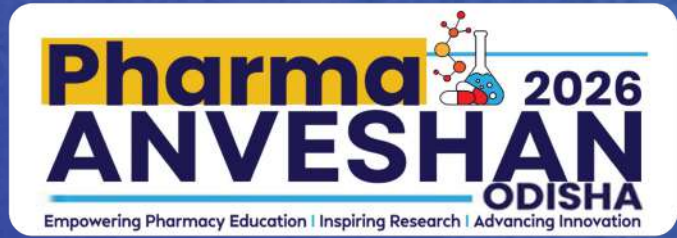

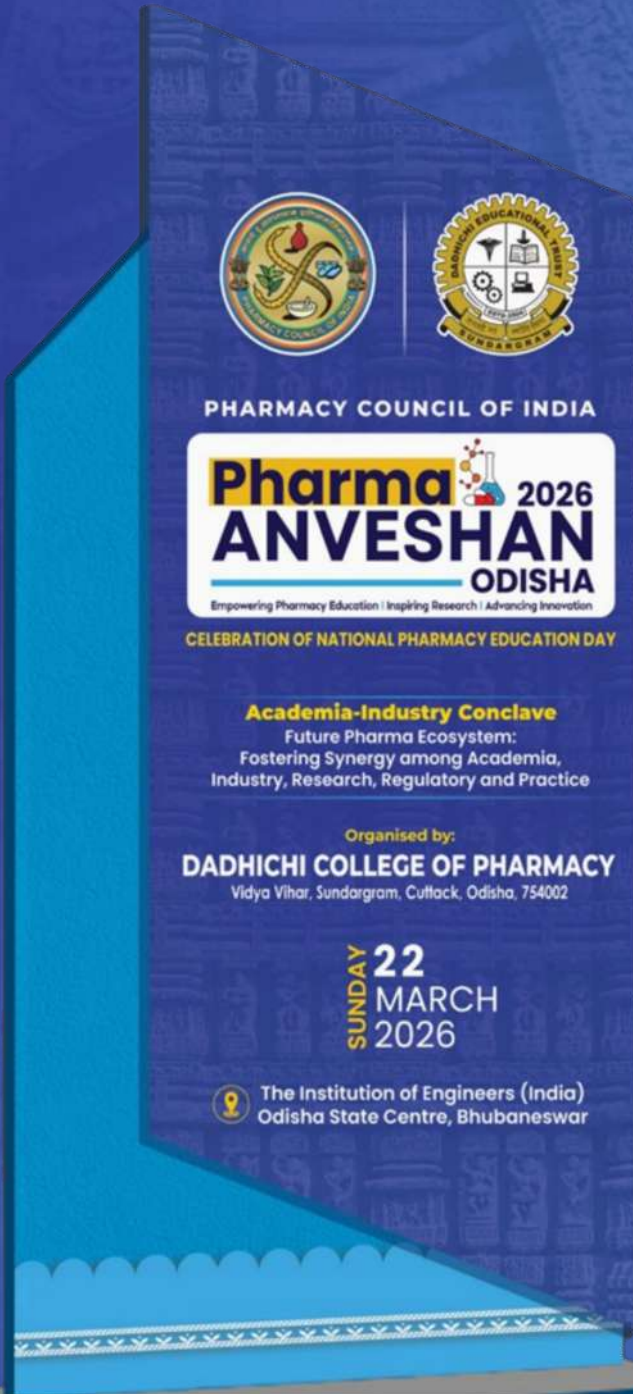
Technical Session-I

Regulatory Insights: Advancing Affordable Medicines for All

Session 1, titled “Regulatory Insights: Advancing Affordable Medicines for All,” was conducted as a highly informative and thought-provoking segment of Pharma Anveshan 2026, reflecting the crucial intersection between regulation, accessibility, and public health. The session was led by **Dr. Lalit Kumar Sahu**, Deputy Drugs Controller, Odisha and President, IPGA, Odisha, along with **Dr. Amiya Kanta Mishra**, Principal, CPS, Puri.

Dr. Lalit Kumar Sahu addressed on Affordable medicines must emerge from a balance between strict regulation and ethical industry practices, ensuring quality without economic burden. Regulatory bodies like NPPA must act not merely as enforcers, but as facilitators of accessibility and public trust in the healthcare system. This is an essential factor for **Health for All**.

Dr. Amiya Kanta Mishra highlighted about the future of pharmacy lies in integrating regulatory awareness with academic excellence to produce responsible professionals. Ensuring affordability is not only a policy goal but a moral obligation for most vulnerable populations of the society.





Leadership Talk

Emerging Pharmaceutical Ecosystem in Odisha: Opportunities and Future Prospects (Odisha Pharma Vision 2036)

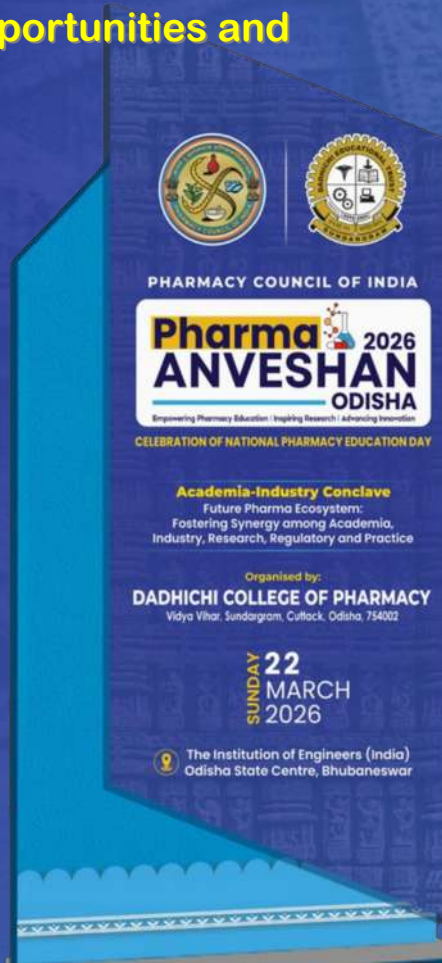
Session 2 of Pharma Anveshan 2026, delivered by Sj. Ramakanta Panigrahi, General Manager, Abicee Pharmaceuticals Pvt. Ltd and Dr. Rajat Kumar Kar, Principal, Dadhichi College of Pharmacy, State Coordinator cum Convener of Pharma Anveshan 2026 focused on the rapid growth of the pharmaceutical sector in Odisha under Odisha Pharma Vision 2036.

The session highlighted that during the Odisha Pharma Summit 2025, around 45 MoUs were signed, attracting investments of approximately ₹6,000–₹7,000 crore, with a projected employment generation of 38,000–40,000 jobs. A major portion of these investments is directed towards pharmaceutical manufacturing, medical devices, and industrial parks, strengthening the state’s industrial base.

The Government of Odisha aims to attract ₹25,000 crore investment and generate nearly 1 lakh jobs by 2030 through its Pharma Policy 2025. Emphasis was also placed on R&D growth, innovation, and patent development, with a long-term vision to significantly enhance research output.

From a research and innovation perspective, Odisha Pharma Vision 2036 emphasizes strong R&D development, targeting an increase in R&D expenditure up to 2.5% of GSDP by 2036, along with a rise in patents from 567 to 15,000 annually, reflecting a long-term commitment to innovation and intellectual property generation.

The session also critically highlighted the need for skilled manpower and academic transformation. The speaker stressed that industry–academia collaboration, skill-based education, and practical training are essential to meet the demands of the upcoming pharmaceutical industries. The integration of AI, biotechnology, and advanced manufacturing technologies was identified as a key driver for future competitiveness.





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Academic Session

From Policy to Practice: Transforming Pharmaceutical Education under NEP 2020 and SDGs through the PCI Curriculum Reform Initiative”

Session 3, titled “From Policy to Practice: Transforming Pharmaceutical Education under NEP 2020 and SDGs through the PCI,” was conducted as a highly analytical and policy-driven segment of Pharma Anveshan 2026. The session was delivered by **Dr. Deependra Singh**, Chairman, Education Regulation Committee, Pharmacy Council of India.

Dr. Singh highlighted the integration of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into pharmacy education, advocating for a shift toward skill-based learning, interdisciplinary approaches, and outcome-oriented training.

He outlined key initiatives such as a revised syllabus for B.Pharm, Up skilling programme in collaboration with the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA), and certification-based skill development courses. The introduction of advanced M. Pharm specializations including Artificial Intelligence in Drug Discovery & Development, Biopharmaceutical & Bioinformatics, and Clinical Research & Pharmacovigilance, Medical Device and Biopharmaceutical Management reflected a strategic response to global trends. One year course in College and one year in Industry. Furthermore, the proposed industry-integrated academic model underscored a transformative approach to bridging the gap between theory and practice.

Technical Session-II

Campus to Corporate: Integrating Education 4.0 with Pharma 4.0

Session 4, titled “Campus to Corporate: Integrating Education 4.0 with Pharma 4.0,” was conducted as a highly engaging and industry-oriented segment of Pharma Anveshan 2026. The session featured insightful deliberations by **Sj. Rajat Mohapatra, President – Manufacturing, Sapigen Biologix Pvt Ltd**, and **Dr. Santosh Kumar Mahapatra, Dean, OUHS, Bhubaneswar**.

Sj. Rajat Mohapatra highlighted Industry 4.0, where technologies like artificial intelligence, automation, and data analytics are transforming every sector, including education and the pharmaceutical industry.

Whereas Dr. Santosh Kumar Mahapatra described Education 4.0. It focuses on modern learning methods such as digital education, personalized learning, and skill-based training. It prepares students not just with theoretical knowledge, but with practical and technological skills needed for the future.

They expressed that Pharma 4.0 represents the modernization of the pharmaceutical sector. It includes smart manufacturing, AI-driven drug discovery, real-time data monitoring, and automated production systems.

However, there is a gap between what students learn in campuses and what industries expect. Many graduates lack hands-on experience, digital skills, and an understanding of real-world pharmaceutical operations.

To bridge this gap, integration is essential. Educational institutions must update their curriculum to include data science, artificial intelligence, and regulatory knowledge. Industry collaboration is also important through internships, live projects, and expert sessions. Additionally, the use of smart labs and simulation-based learning can give students real-world exposure.

This integration benefits everyone. Students become job-ready, industries get skilled professionals, and educational institutions stay relevant in a rapidly evolving world.

In conclusion, aligning Education 4.0 with Pharma 4.0 is the key to creating a future-ready workforce and ensuring a smooth transition from campus to corporate.





Technical Session-III

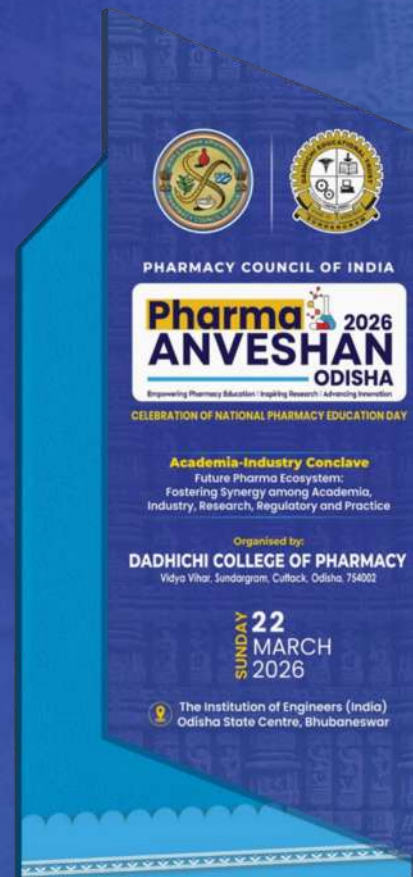
Imagination to Implementation: Shaping a Culture of Innovation

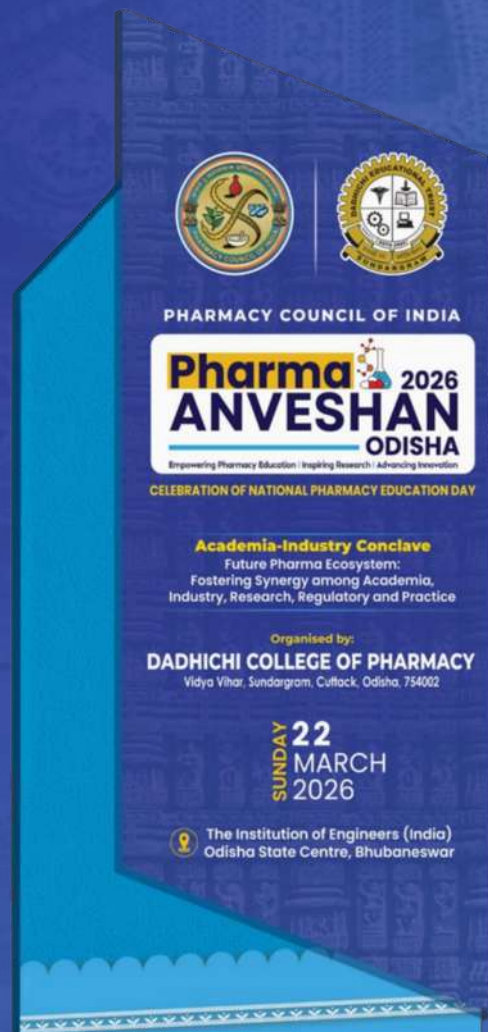
My Profession, My Dream – A Commitment toward Viksit Bharat

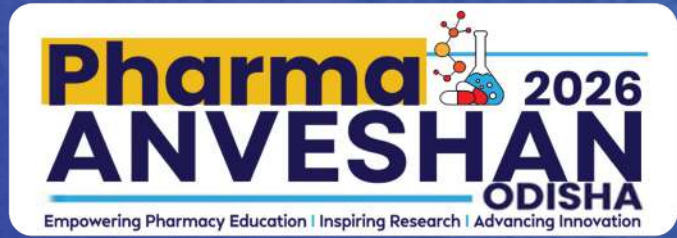

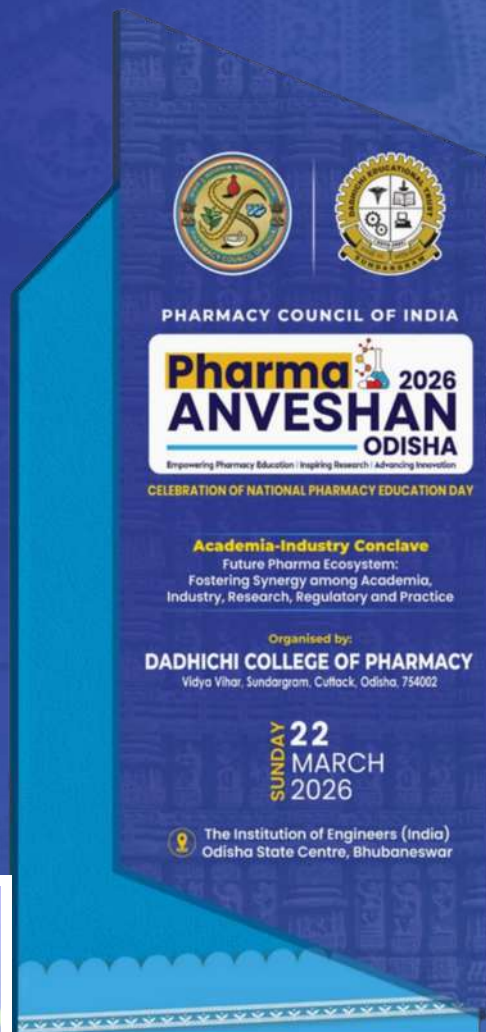
Young Leaders' Dialogue
